Qualifications

The Southern Pines Police Department maintains a competitive hiring process. Applicants must be 20 years of age by date of employment, be a high school graduate or GED equivalent, be of good character and be able to be certified as a police officer by the State of North Carolina. Candidates who possess a North Carolina Basic Law Enforcement Training program (BLET) certificate are preferred. Lateral candidates who are certified as a police officer in North Carolina or another state are encouraged to apply.

Candidates for selection participate in an oral interview, writing test, background investigation, medical examination, drug test, psychological exam and firearms qualification.

Candidates are selected based upon the needs of the department. After selection, and certification, Police Officer Trainees participate in an extensive Field Training and Evaluation Program designed to transition the new officer from the academy classroom and provide for the practical application of their skills.

The Southern Pines Police Department is a highly trained, professional organization that has embraced the concept of Community Oriented Policing. The department provides all equipment and training necessary to carry out our mission in the community.
